A charge to keep I have, A God to glorify, A never-dying soul to save, And fit it for the sky. To serve the present age, My calling to fulfill: Oh, may it all my pow'rs engage To do my Master's will! The words of Charles Wesley's Hymn still rings in my ears through the voices of the old saints at the church I grew up in down in Hitch Village.

Though small and seemingly insignificant, I'm convinced that every act of love can point somebody to Jesus. May we never become so insulated in our church buildings and institutions that we fail to share our faith by serving others.
